2020 PRESIDENTS REPORT



Dear Bulls Community

This year will certainly be a year that we will remember due to the challenges that we have all had to face both on and off the field. For the first time in living memory we have witnessed clubs which are supported by large leagues clubs pull out of both the junior and senior rugby league competitions. Despite the disruption the Mighty Bulls charged on to compete in all competitions. We have been determined not to disappoint our large community of players, supporters and friends.

I would like to thank the work of our board members, sponsors, parents, players and our wider Bulls community who have volunteered and contributed throughout the year to assist us in satisfying the ever-changing regulations which we all have had to adhere to. Thanks to your support our teams had the necessary equipment both on the training paddock and playing games of footy and tag in season 2020. We have a strong community supported by an unwavering mantra of CLUB – TEAM – PLAYER.

Rick Palin, our club Administrator and Secretary went above and beyond this year to have workable COVID plans in place enabling the season to commence and run smoothly – thanks for all your hard work Rick. Matt Brady and his team at Parramatta, along with the NSWRL are also to be congratulated for helping our teams to get back on to the field and ultimately completing a successful season.

Our Coaching and Development team once again successfully sourced a fantastic list of coaches which has in turn been a driving force in delivering the results that we have achieved.

From our 36 teams we had 28 eligible teams that could make the finals resulting in an impressive:

- 20 Teams making the Semi Finals
- 14 Teams competing in a Grand Final
- 8 Minor Premiers
- 6 Teams the 2020 Premiers

Once again our girl's league teams were a credit to our great club with fantastic results with two teams going through undefeated minor Premiers and Premiers. Congratulations to Myles Martin gaining selection to the Under 16 Australian Merit School Boy team.

This year we saw former Bulls players Ryan Papaenhuyzen and Tom Eisenhuth represent the Melbourne Storm in the NRL Grand Final Qualifier against former Bull Tom Starling's Canberra Raiders. Both Ryan and Tom Starling were team mates in the Hills Bulls Juniors together, while Tom Eisenhuth played for the Bulls Ron Massey

team. Ryan went on to score a try and win the Clive Churchill medal as the best player in the NRL Grand Final – an awesome achievement. Luke Keary also played the NRL final's series with the Roosters, while Josh Curran moved across to the New Zealand Warriors. Blake Green made a move from New Zealand to Newcastle. Congratulations to Ryan Papenhuyzen and Luke Keary who were both selected in the NSW State of Origin squad, with Luke making his long awaited Origin debut. Luke Keary never forgets his junior club and as always joined us for our Hills Bulls Mini clinic. Well done boys, another proud achievement for the Bulls.

With the NRL in the "bubble" throughout 2020, and the cancellation of The Canterbury Cup and Junior Reps, we saw the launch of the Presidents Cup Competition. This was ultimately the second tier competition in the NRL and the Mighty Bulls had an impressive line-up, led by our Club Captain Tim Robinson. It has been immensely satisfying to witness the Hills Bulls playing at the highest level of sport in the Hills District and creating a pathway for our junior players to aspire to. Once again we were agonisingly close to securing a place in the Grand Final for the second year in succession, defeated by the Maitland Pickers who went on to be Premiers.

Presidents Cup, Sydney Shield and our Under 20's teams all provided inspirational performances for The Nathan Gremmo Memorial Shield Day, with all teams winning convincingly. Presidents Cup defeated Dubbo CYMS 44-4 whilst Sydney Shield defeated Moorebank 40-0. Our under 20's team, many of whom played with Nathan at the Bulls defeated Moorebank 24-16. The Moorebank under 20's team also unselfishly gave up their home game to play before Shield on Nathan's Day. All teams truly embraced Nathan's legacy. It is always amazing to witness players coming together and working as a team to achieve a desired result. The commitment in defence in particular was outstanding.

On a personal note, my family would like to thank all of the Hills Bulls community for embracing Nathan's Legacy through their support of Jersey Day and The Nathan Gremmo Memorial Shield. Assisting in saving lives through organ donation is the greatest gift you can provide. Our little mate continues to inspire others through his donation story and will do so long into the future. 
Next to go over was Trent M from




