Remembering Paul 'Griffo' Griffin

Last year we lost a Club icon and mate – Paul Griffin. Griffo was a Life member, tireless volunteer and generous supporter. His spirit continues to guide this club.

In honour of Griffo, we:

- Celebrated Griffo's life with a heartfelt service at Crestwood Oval, attended by thousands of Griffo's family and friends.
- Opened Griffo's Gym at Crestwood Oval A high-performance facility and community hub that reflects his legacy.
- Held the Inaugural Griffo's Cup against Wentworthville and Ryde Eastwood.
- Celebrated the announcement by NSWRL of the Paul Griffin Award for the Ron Massey Cup Grand Final Player of the Match.
- Hosted the first ever Griffo's Long Legend Lunch a sell-out event filled with mateship, footy, and heart. Thank you to Joel Cain and the Parra Legends Sterlo, Muggo, Pebbles and Guru for donating your time and stories. Raising nearly \$100,000 towards our \$350,000 goal for the Community Centre.
- Welcomed the new Bulls Greyhound Syndicate, a runaway success thanks to Wayne Franklin. We now have three Greyhounds, including one affectionately named 'Don't Tell Robyn'.

Griffo's generosity continues to inspire us – especially through his final gift of organ donation. His legacy lives on in every corner of this Club.

Club Events & Social Impact

- Launched the 'Our Club Our Legacy' campaign including the 'Buy-A-Brick, Build a Legacy' initiative and raffle ticket sales for the NRL Vegas Trip all raising funds for the Hills Bulls Community Centre, although we have seen disappointing results to date from the teams selling very little tickets raising only 30% of estimated ticket sales.
- Completed the High-Performance Gym.
- Jersey Day and the Nathan Gremmo Shield once again raised awareness for organ donation and brought the community together with a huge crowd at Crestwood. The Hills Bulls Sports Lunch (5th September 2025) and Hills Bulls Golf Fundraiser (18th November 2025 at Castle Hill Country Club) remain calendar highlights.
- Our digital presence continues to grow thanks to our media team. Visit our updated website and follow us on Social Media platforms to stay connected.
- We have raised over \$205,000 of the \$350,000 required to build the Hills Bulls Community Centre. Thank you to all who've contributed we are over halfway there, and in true Bulls spirit, we will finish what we have started.

Junior Rugby League & League Tag

Hills Bulls Sports Club has continued to dominate across competitions – a credit to everyone involved.

- 48 League and League Tag teams (including 9 female teams)
- 23 of 28 eligible teams reaching the finals
- 14 Grand Finalists
- 6 Premiership winners (U21s, U15/1s, U14/1 LeagueTag, U12/1 LeagueTag, U12/2 LeagueTag & All-Abilities team
- 4 players from our All-Abilities team selected for the Parramatta Rep team defeating Penriths Rep team in the Battle of the West
- Numerous players selected for the male and female Development and Representative Squads.

Senior Rugby League

It was an exciting year with Jason Baitieri, a Bulls junior, returning as Club Captain after a stellar international, NRL and Super League career. Jason will join the Coaching team in 2026.

Congratulations to Taniela Lasalo who was awarded the NSWRL Ron Massey Cup Player of the Year.

While 2025 was a rebuilding year for our Ron Massey and Sydney Shield squads, we saw strong junior progression into the senior ranks. Recruitment and retention are well underway for 2026.

Our alliances with the North Sydney Bears and Parramatta Eels continue to build a strong development pathway from grassroots to the NRL.

Open Age Womens team – 2025 Grand Finalists – Our female program continues to build and grow.

Oztag Highlights

- Over 5,000 registered players and 400 teams competed in our 2025 Winter & Summer competitions
- The Hills Bulls Representative Program was outstanding at the NSW State Championships
- Out of 17 teams contesting at the State Cup, 14 teams made it through to the Finals campaign, with the U16 Girls being crowned State Cup Champions
- A huge thank you to Leon Don, the Marshall family, and all supporting families for your dedication

In Closing

Our female programs and growth have been enormous.

Parramatta District Awards – Hills Bulls would have been awarded the Club Championship again if the criteria remained as it was since 1947.

NSW State Government unfortunately ruled our grant application ineligible for the \$100,000 which was fully endorsed by our local member Ray Williams MP as the land owner did not give us permission to build on their land which is incorrect as we have a letter endorsing the building, Development Approval, Modification Approval and Construction Certificate and commenced work on site under their inspections. State Government then cancelled the Q4 grant and will have the grant reopened in 2026.

On Sunday, 16th November, the NSWRL had their community day at Olympic Park and we were presented with a \$200,000 grant towards the Community Centre, which we will commence construction in 2026.

3. Topic Annual Financial Report FY24/25 | Presenter Rick Palin

Discussion: Rick Palin gave an overview of the finances for the club. Financial Statements and Audit Report for the year ended 30 September 2025 prepared by Jigsaw Tax Accountants and audited by Peter Gunton was provided to all attendees and tabled at the meeting (attached to minutes).

Operating Result: The surplus for the financial year amounted to \$228,492. This is compared to a surplus of \$122,574 in the previous financial year.

4. Topic Life Membership Nomination | Presenter Leon Don

Life Membership Nomination – Graham Marshall (Nominated by Leon Don – Life Member & endorsed by fellow Life Member Leon Carroll):

- o Leon Don read out the Life Member Nomination and details.
- o Graham was asked to leave the room, so the AGM attendees could discuss and vote.
- o Graham was voted in by the members of the floor with a unanimous vote.
- o Graham was invited back into the room and congratulated on his Life Membership.

5. Topic General Business | Presenter All

General Discussion was had on:

- Discussion item 1 Oztag Committee and member involvement:
 - o Rick Palin advised that he had received multiple queries as to how people can get ointo committees and more involved in decision making or assisting with running Oztag etc.
 - o Rick advised that it was a simple as putting your hand up and nominating to join the subcommittee you are interested in. Rick also stated that if you do put your hand up, then make sure you can commit, as we have a lot of people out there who insist on what we can do better, but very few people who want to commit and be part of the change makers and doers.
 - o Mick Gremmo also said that we are always looking for more people to assist in all areas.
 - Kerry Barnard said that the people who have nominated are committed and want to give more hands to make work lighter.
 - o Jason Brettle advised he has been around Oztag for many years now and feels that his experience could greatly assist running of oztag and coaching and development roles.

• MPIO:

 Michael Gremmo asked if Marty Shanahan if he would like to go around again as the Club Member Protection Information Officer (MPIO) which Marty said he would like to go around in the role again in 2026.

• 2026 Canteen Manager:

- Kerry Barnard and Lauren Rizzo both queried what the Club was going to do with the Canteen
 Manager role now that Aimee Gonzalez is stepping down from the role at the end of this season.
- o Rick Palin advised that we do have an annual honorarium of \$3k for the person who owns the role and runs the canteen over the Rugby League and Oztag seasons. Kerry and Lauren asked would this be something that could be split multiple ways for two or three people to take on the role together? It was discussed and this could be something that can be done, but people will need to be committed and make sure the job is done correctly and in a sustainable way.
- Kerry will put together an advertisement and run it by the Board to start advertising for new person or team to run the canteen in 2026.

• Oztag Growth:

- o Jason Brettle asked if we could build on the prize money over the weekly adult comps to help build and increase comp participation.
- o Leon Don and Graham Marshall both advised that for the Summer Comps to increase, we would need more green space as we are at maximum capacity, and with more grounds we need more people to be able to run the comps. Graham also advised that Winter Oztag has oom for growth but the issues we have are ground allocations – ie. Showground not be available when the Circus is on then there is the issue with the state of the fields that we can get.
- Leon Carroll wanted to congratulate the outgoing Board & Committee and say Well Done to the incoming Board for season 2026.
